GO GREEN AT HAYGOOD!

Class parties typically leave a lot of waste behind. While disposable paper products and individually wrapped items are extremely convenient, Haygood encourages parents planning the class parties to "Go Green." With a little planning, it should be worth the effort to have a "Waste-free" party and it sends a positive message to our kids! How to have a Waste-Free Party:

- Haygood has provided plastic plates and cups for each class! These items can be rinsed off after the party and taken home by a parent volunteer to wash
- Skip the juice boxes! Bring in pitchers for water or purchase the large containers of juice or milk.
- Use cloth napkins and tablecloths. Have a parent volunteer to wash them.
- Bring foods that are not individually wrapped. Serve muffins, fruit, sliced cheese or finger sandwiches. Bring them in reusable containers.
- Plan a craft that uses natural materials, like decorating a pinecone as a Christmas ornament. Or instead of a craft, play music and dance. Read books related to the holiday being celebrated.
- Avoid plastic "goodie bag" items as party favors
